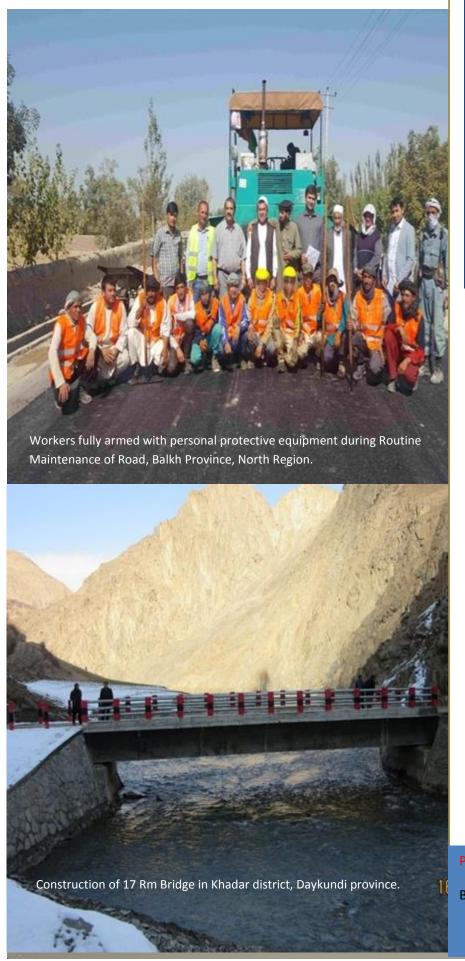

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This summary and report covers the overall progress made during 3rd quarter (21 September, 2016 – 20 December, 2016) of 1395 toward performance indicators of the projects implemented through National Rural Access Program (NRAP) particularly Afghanistan Rural Access Project (ARAP). Bellow summary include the achievements of components A, B and C of ARAP project, however, the detailed data is provided in annexes (A) & (B) of this report.

- 1) COMPONENT (A) SECONDARY ROADS-MoPW: This component of ARAP project is executed by MoPW and covers improvement and maintenance of the Major local (District) roads. The cumulative physical achievement since inception; 2012 to the end of 3rd quarter 1395 is construction of 439.84 Km gravel surface road, 164.06 Km asphalt surface roads, 1,388.10 Running meter bridges and 92,219.20 Linear meters associated drainage structures and generated 1,367,510 labor days. Whereas 93.57 Km gravel road, 22 Km asphalt road, 90 Rm running meters bridges and 17,010 linear meters associated drainage structures constructed during the reporting period.
- 2) COMPONENT (B) TERTIARY ROADS-MRRD: This component of ARAP project is executed by MRRD and covers improvement and maintenance of the minor local (village) roads. The cumulative physical achievement since inception; 2012 to the end of 3rd quarter 1395 is construction of 1,264 km of village roads, 1,814 Running meter bridge, 56,719 linear meters associated drainage structures as well as generated 1,653,756 labor days. Whereas 66 km road, 330 Running bridges, 3,034 linear meters associated drainage structures constructed during the reporting period.
- 3) COMPONENT (C) PROGRAM PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT, INSTITUTIONAL STRENGTHENING, AND PROGRAM COORDINATION SUPPORT: This component is jointly executed by MoPW and MRRD for various activities which will be undertaken by each individual, while ensuring close coordination with each other, facilitated by the National Coordination Unit (NCU).
 - Gap Analysis in national road network including district road has been conducted. New version of road network databased has been released and data collection of road network planning is ongoing and it is completed in 15 provinces and 70% of national highways.
 - 2. Since inception of the project different types of short, long term and on the job trainings were provided to individuals, meeting the preset selection criteria. Both domestic and international trainings provided to program staff in different fields such as, CCNA, MSCD, Project Management and Academic English courses to civil servant, while required on the job trainings were provided to internship students and fresh graduate engineers indoor. Moreover, as per plan construction of one remaining NRAP building is 100% completed during 3rd quarter of 1395 under this sub component.
 - 3. Beside regular data flow to program stakeholders through NRAP website, newsletter, media report; Senior Management Meetings for additional fund, monthly coordination meeting, technical coordination meeting as well as ad hoc Senior Management Meeting conducted for project preparation and other related issues. Moreover, recruitment process of hiring one consultant for follow up survey is completed and initial activities such as designing the questionnaires, preparation of sampled subproject list is completed and enumerators hiring process is started.

AFGHANISTAN RURAL ACCESS PROJECT (ARAP)

I. PHYSICAL PROGRESS

1. COMPONENT (A) DISTRICT ROADS

Subcomponent A1, A2 & A3: By completion of third quarter of 1395, total 97 contracts were completed which resulted in rehabilitation of 439.84 Km gravel surface and 164.06 asphalt surface road, as well as construction of 1,388.10 running meter bridges while total 24 contracts rehabilitation of total 246.32 km road (169.97 Km gravel roads, 76.35 Km asphalt road), construction of 28 running meters bridge and 14,094 linear meter associate drainage structures are positively progressing.

Specifically during the reporting period 93.57 Km gravel road, 22 Km asphalt road, 90 running meter bridge and 17,010 linear meter associate drainage structures have been constructed.

Bellow table indicates the details progress since inception and during the reporting quarter.

Subcomponent A4: This subcomponent is allocated for maintenance of secondary road. Since inception of the project to the end of 3rd quarter of 1395 the periodic maintenance efforts have been applied to 514.59 Km road while 32 emergency maintenance contracts have been completed. Likewise 143 contracts with total length of 1,554.21 km road are completed and 122 contracts with total length of 1,428.19 km are currently ongoing under routine maintenance.

Moreover, 9 post disaster sub-projects with total cost of 2,485,508.35\$ and generation of 35,211.37 labor days are successfully completed under this sub component.

Subcomponent A5: During 3rd Quarter of 1395 ESM report, 5 ESM Plans were prepared for 5 Subprojects, 2265 out of 4,413,452 beneficiaries were trained/consulted, 90 community consultations meetings held at different stages of the project. Likewise 57 subprojects have been visited during the reporting period. The demand for extra culverts and drainage structure and hiring more community labor during project implementation were the common issues among different subproject's beneficiaries. Therefore most of the issues solved through consultation with contractors and providing technical information to communities.

2. COMPONENT (B) VILLAGE ROADS

Subcomponent B1 & B2: These sub-components of ARAP has successfully completed 24 contracts during 3rd quarter of 1395 which resulted in rehabilitation of 66 km of roads, 330 running meters of bridges, 3,034 linear meters associated drainage structures and generated 154,851 labor days while it has constructed total 1,264 Km of roads, 1,814 running meter of bridge and 56,719 associated drainage structures since inception of the project. Moreover, 24 contracts to construct 135 Km of roads and 223 running meters of bridge are positively progressing.

Subcomponent B3: This subcomponent is maintenance centric and entails emergency routine and periodic maintenance of ARAP constructed village road.

Emergency Maintenance: Under this sub-component, emergency repairing of flood affected roads and road structures are being done. These works are usually contracted with communities and implemented through them. As of 3rd quarter of 1395, fifty nine emergency contracts have been signed for maintenance of infrastructures as well as clearing of road surfaces due to flood and landslides under this subcomponent.

Snow Cleaning: As of 3rd quarter of 1395 almost 758 km of tertiary roads has been unblocked under this subcomponent since inception of the project and in contrast to the past during this quarter no snow clearance took place.

Routine Maintenance: This subcomponent incorporate routine maintenance of the program constructed village roads. So far 3,570 km of road is under routine maintenance through 256 contracts in ARAP project.

<u>Periodic Maintenance</u>: Periodic maintenance constitutes part of the Component B3. Insofar, 7 contracts include 502 km road have been completed and 8 contract include 436 km is under procurement.

Subcomponent B4: During the 3rd quarter of 1395, total 33 ESMP were prepared, 1,742 people were trained, 55 coordination meetings have been held and 51 GRC have been established. Likewise 50 Community Participatory Monitoring and 2 social audits have been conducted, 23 social issues such as land acquisition have been solved. Last but not least 13,579 m2 of lands have been donated by the communities during the reporting period.

3 COMPONENT (C) PROGRAM PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT, INSTITUTIONAL STRENGTHENING, AND PROGRAM COORDINATION SUPPORT

The overall objective of this component is institutional strengthening, project management and program development which are segregated into three subcomponents of C1, and C2 and C3. The subcomponents are articulated as bellow:

Subcomponent C1 (Rural Roads Network Planning and Management System): During this quarter there was a joint technical meeting of both PIUs held to evaluate the technical aspects of the Network Planning and Management System. Moreover, the consultant has brought some of the suggested changes of the MIS team and recovered the system.

In addition, NRAP/MoPW has the responsibility of data collection for primary and secondary road network. The data collection has been successfully completed for 70% of national highways and 15 provinces (Balkh, Jawzjan, Samangan, Sar-e-Pul, Baghlan, Faryab, Kabul, Parwan, Panjsher, Kapisa, Bamyan, Daykundi, Khost, Paktya, and logar) as of end of 3rd quarter of 1395.

Subcomponent C2 (Institutional Strengthening and Capacity Building): Throughout the reporting period different types of short-term trainings are provide for NRAP staff inside and outside the country. Following is some of the completed and in progress trainings for NRAP staff during 3rd quarter of 1395:

- Master degree programs for NRAP staff are under process.
- HDM-4 training for two staff of GIS section in India, implemented
- Gender mainstreaming training is under process.
- EIA Training in Egypt for 11 NRAP staff implemented.
- Pavement evaluation technics training conducted in India.

Furthermore, as one of the activities under this subcomponent is construction of functional office and laboratory buildings in the eighth reginal offices and improving the program library, so construction works of one reaming NRAP building is 100% completed during the reporting period.

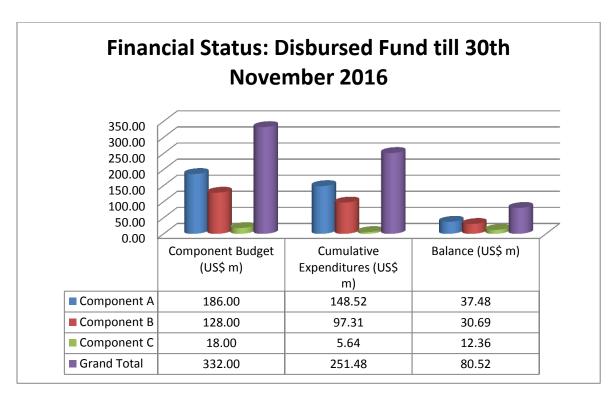
Subcomponent C3 (Program Coordination Support): Regular data flow to the program stakeholders through NRAP website, publishing monthly newsletter, media reporting, steering committee meetings for additional fund, monthly coordination meeting, technical coordination meeting as well as ad hoc Senior Management Meeting for the project preparation and other related issues are commencing under this subcomponent.

The recruitment process of hiring one consultant for ARAP project mid-term review is 100% completed and some of the initial activities such as designing the questionnaires, preparation of sampled subproject list is completed and enumerators hiring process is started to conduct the survey. Moreover, recruitment process of Finance Specialist is under process. Following is some the completed activities under this subcomponent during the reporting period:

- Printing and publishing of monthly newsletter
- Timely media reporting
- Two monthly coordination meeting is conducted
- Two technical coordination meeting is conducted with MSI and the program technical team
- Two monitoring and evaluation meeting for follow up survey is conducted

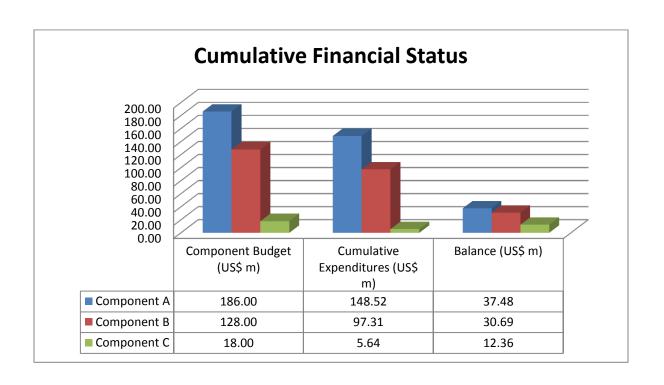

OTHER ONGOING PROJECTS UNDER (NRAP)

1. NRAP-MoF

This project has been funded from the discretionary fund of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan to construct 580 km of road and 850 meters of bridge through total cumulative budget of USD 41.06 million in different years.

NRAP/MRRD has succeeded to complete 20 contracts under this project and achieved construction of 24 km of roads and 220 running meters of bridge moreover it has generated 68,838 labor days during the reporting period.

2. JAPAN-FUND

This project has been funded by Japan with total budget of USD 23.5 million for delivering 190 km of road (Asphalt and Gravel) and 586 meter of bridges in 34 provinces of Afghanistan.

NRAP/MRRD has succeeded to complete 6 contracts under this project and achieved construction of 11 km of roads and 2,714 meters of drainage structure moreover it has generated 11,175 labor days during the reporting period.

3. JICA & GOA Fund

This project has been funded by JICA & GOV and the executing implementer is NRAP-MoPW. The cumulative budget of this project is almost US\$ 133.1M in different years starting in SY1390 for delivering 351.06 Km of roads and 1,381 Running meters of bridges in different provinces of Afghanistan. The design and procurement of this project has been completed.

Moreover, 44 contracts have been completed through which 229.1 Km roads, 1,199.0 Rm bridges have been constructed and 553,544.83 number of labor days are generated as of 3rd quarter of 1395.

CHALLENGES AND OBSTACLE

1. SECURITY

Security constraints seriously challenge the pace, cost and quality of the subprojects in construction. The stoppages, additional security requirements in volatile areas, as well as inability to provide adequate and regular technical oversight and guidance to contractors, especially in South, South East, North, Northeast and West Provinces negatively affect the pace and cost of the subproject and workmanship.

Particular measure has been taken in this regard. The program prepared strategy for implementation of already started subprojects in insecure area through involving community in construction, however, the concern is still exist for new contracts.

2. WEATHER

Even though a climatic plan has been developed to maintain the correct implementation period and for the purpose the entire country is divided into three zones by three different construction seasons, but the accidental flooding and snow fall in the country sometime disconnects the construction process and affect the progress.
