

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This summary consolidates the overall progress made toward performance indicators of the projects including ARAP during 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 1396. The highlights include the achievements of components A, B and C of the ARAP project while briefly indicated the overall progress of other projects under NRAP during reporting period. The detailed data provided in annexes (A) & (B).

- 1) COMPONENT (A) SECONDARY ROADS-MoPW: This component is executed by MoPW and covers improvement and maintenance of the secondary (District) roads. The cumulative physical achievement since inception (2012) of the project to the end of 4th quarter of 1396 is construction of 539 Km gravel surface road, 241.9 Km asphalt surface roads, 1,416.1 Running meter bridges, 127,446.20 Linear meters associated drainage structures and generated 3,012,117.45 labor days. While 16.17 Km gravel surface and 12 Km asphalt, surface road constructed during the reporting period.
- 2) COMPONENT (B) TERTIARY ROADS-MRRD: This component executed by MRRD and covers improvement and maintenance of the tertiary (village) roads. The cumulative physical achievement since inception; 2012 of the project to the end of 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 1396 is construction of 1,401 km of village roads, 2,108 Running meter bridge (includes 470 Rm bridges under B1), 64,769.47 linear meters associated drainage structures as well as generated 1,813,782 labor days. Whereas indicative achievement of 2 km road, 121 Running meter bridges construction and generated 29,534 labor days reported during the reporting period.
- 3) COMPONENT (C) PROGRAM PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT, INSTITUTIONAL STRENGTHENING, AND PROGRAM COORDINATION SUPPORT: This component is jointly executed by MoPW and MRRD for various activities which will be undertaken by each individual, while ensuring close coordination with each other, facilitated by the National Coordination Unit (NCU).
  - Gap Analysis in national road network including district road, conducted. New version of road network database has released and data collection of road network planning is ongoing and completed in 25 provinces, 70% of national highways.
  - 2. Since inception of the project different types of short, long term and on the job trainings has provided to individuals, meeting the preset selection criteria. Both domestic and international trainings provided to program staff in different fields such as, CCNA, MSCD, Project Management and Academic English courses to civil servant, while required on job trainings have provided to internship students and fresh graduate engineers indoor. Moreover, it is worthy to report that constructions of all eight NRAP buildings are completed.
  - 3. Beside regular data flow to program stakeholders through NRAP website, newsletter, media report; steering committee meetings, monthly coordination meeting, technical coordination meeting as well as ad hoc Senior Management Meeting conducted for project strategic implementation and oversights.

#### AFGHANISTAN RURAL ACCESS PROJECT (ARAP)

#### I. PHYSICAL PROGRESS

#### 1. COMPONENT (A) DISTRICT ROADS

Subcomponent A1, A2 & A3: By completion of this report as fourth quarter of 1396, total 114 contracts were completed which resulted in rehabilitation of 539 Km gravel surface and 241.9 asphalt surface road, as well as construction of 1,416.1 running meter bridges. However, total 18 contracts for rehabilitation of total 186.38 km road (150.93 Km gravel roads, 35.45 Km asphalt road), construction of 64 running meters' bridge and 12,707 linear meter associate drainage structures are positively in progress.

Bellow table indicates the details progress since inception and during the reporting quarter.


**Subcomponent A4:** This subcomponent allocated for maintenance of secondary road. Since inception of the project to the end of 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 1396, the periodic maintenance efforts have applied to 521.48 Km road and 34 emergency maintenance contracts have completed. Likewise, 377 contracts with total length of 4,129.62 km road has already completed under routine maintenance.

Moreover, nine post disaster sub-projects with total cost of 2,485,508.35\$ and generation of 263,671.01labor days are successfully completed since inception of the project under subcomponent A4.

Subcomponent A5: ESM report for 4th Quarter of 1396, 6 ESM Plans were prepared for 6 Subprojects, 2,317 beneficiaries (1,441 male and 876 female) were trained/consulted, 94 community consultations meetings (70 with male and 24 with female) held at different stages of the project. Moreover, 2,847.5 m2 of lands have donated via communities. Likewise, 69 subprojects have visited during the reporting period. Twelve different issues, such as air pollution, hiring more community laborers by contractor, design and land donation asserted by communities where most of the issues solved through consultation with contractors alongside providing technical information to communities.

#### 2. COMPONENT (B) VILLAGE ROADS

Subcomponent B1 & B2: These sub-components of ARAP has partially completed. Total 1,401 Km of roads, 2,108 running meter of bridge, 64,769-associated drainage structures have constructed and 1,813,782 labor days generated since inception of the project However, ten contracts that resulted in rehabilitation of 17 km of roads, 2,913 linear meters associated drainage structures completed during reporting period and generated 29,534 labor days. Moreover, seven contracts to construct 58 Km of roads and 80 running meters of bridge is ongoing.

Subcomponent B3: This subcomponent is maintenance centric and entails emergency, routine and periodic maintenance of ARAP constructed village roads.

Emergency Maintenance: Under this sub-component, emergency repairing of flood affected roads and road structures executed. These type of works usually contracted with communities and implemented through them. Sixty-six emergency contracts have signed for maintenance of infrastructures as well as clearing of road surfaces due to flood and landslides under this subcomponent since inception of the project.

Snow Cleaning: As of 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 1396, almost 758 km of tertiary roads has been unblocked under this subcomponent in all of over the country. NRAP/MRRD toke immediate action with a specific plan for cleaning the affected tertiary roads.

Routine Maintenance: This subcomponent incorporate routine maintenance of the program constructed village roads. So far, 3,550 km of road is under routine maintenance through 248 contracts in ARAP project.

<u>Periodic Maintenance:</u> Periodic maintenance constitutes part of the Component B3. Insofar, 21 contracts include 977 km road have been completed. Moreover, 46 completed contracts include 356 km road and 6 ongoing contracts include 75 km road is reported under MoF project.

Subcomponent B4: During the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 1396, total 5 ESMP were prepared, 1,104 people were trained, 44 coordination meetings have been held, 32 GRC (16 M, 16 FM) have been established and 4,570 number of trees have been planted. Likewise, 34 Community Participatory Monitoring and 12 social audit have conducted, 19 social issues such as land acquisition have solved and 56 environmental monitoring have conducted. The communities have donated finally yet importantly 10,752 m2 of lands during the reporting period.

# 3 COMPONENT (C) PROGRAM PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT, INSTITUTIONAL STRENGTHENING, AND PROGRAM COORDINATION SUPPORT

The overall objective of this component is institutional strengthening, project management and program development, segregated into three subcomponents of C1, and C2 and C3. The subcomponents articulated as bellow:

Subcomponent C1 (Rural Roads Network Planning and Management System): During this quarter, a joint technical meeting of both PIUs held to evaluate the technical aspects of the Network Planning and Management System.

Moreover, NRAP/MoPW has the responsibility of data collection for primary and secondary road network. The data collection has been successfully completed in 14381 Km in which 70% of national highways, 25 provinces completed (Balkh, Jawzjan, Samangan, Sar-e-Pul, Baghlan, Faryab, Kabul, Nimroz, Wardak, Parwan, Panjsher, Kapisa, Bamyan, Daykundi, Khost, Paktya, logar, Kunduz, Takhar, Nangarhar, Kunar, Laghman, Herat, Ghor and Badghis) and also social surveys conducted in 10431 villages as end of 4th quarter of 1396. Moreover, data collection is positively in progress in three provinces (Kandahar, Helmand and Zabul).

Subcomponent C2 (Institutional Strengthening and Capacity Building): Throughout the reporting period different types of short-term trainings are provide for NRAP staff inside and outside the country. Following is some of in progress trainings for NRAP staff during 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 1396:

- Master degree programs for NRAP staff are under process.
- Post- Graduation course for NRAP staff under process.
- Winter workshop and trainings conducted for NRAP-MRRD regional staff

Furthermore, as one of the activities under this subcomponent is construction of functional office and laboratory buildings in the eighth regional offices and improving the program library, so construction works of all 8 NRAP meeting is completed since inception of the project.





#### OTHER ONGOING PROJECTS UNDER (NRAP)

#### 1. NRAP-MoF

This project has, funded from the discretionary fund of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan by the Ministry of Finance to construct 580 km of road and 850 meters of bridge through total cumulative budget of USD 78.3 million in different years.

NRAP/MRRD has succeeded to complete 287 contracts under this project and achieved construction of 836 km of roads, 1,169 running meters of bridge and it has generated 1,101,027 labor days since inception of the project.

#### 2. JAPAN-FUND

This project has, funded by Japan with total budget of USD 23.5 million for delivering 190 km of road (Asphalt and Gravel) and 586 meter of bridges in 34 provinces of Afghanistan.

NRAP/MRRD has succeeded to complete 52 contracts under this project and achieved construction of 205 km of roads, 637 running meters of bridges and it has generated 257,735 labor days since inception of the project.

#### 3. JICA & GOA Fund

This project has funded by JICA & GOV and the executing implementer is NRAP-MoPW. The cumulative budget of this project is almost US\$ 133.1M in different years starting in SY1390 for delivering 351.06 Km of roads and 1,381 Running meters of bridges in different provinces of Afghanistan. The design and procurement of this project has, completed.

Moreover, 56 contracts have, completed through which 339.41 Km roads, 1,533.00 Rm bridges have, constructed and 1,904,741.14number of labor days are generated as of 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 1396.

#### CHALLENGES AND OBSTACLE

#### 1. SECURITY

Insecurity remained a serious challenge to the projects. The dead slow progress, additional security measures involvement particularly in volatile areas and unregulated oversights to specific sites, negatively impacted the pace, cost and workmanship of some contracts.

Particular measure has, taken in this regard. Third party and community monitoring process is in place for ongoing subproject however, the concern still exists for upcoming new contracts.

#### 2. WEATHER

Even though a weather matrix planning has, developed to maintain the correct implementation period and for the purpose, the entire country, divided into three zones by three different construction seasons, but the accidental flooding and snowfall in the country sometime disconnects the construction process and affect the progress.
